 Provides networking opportunities for people who wish to learn from Cochrane colleagues in different parts of the world.

• The programme is open to anyone interested in contributing to Cochrane's work.





What is the purpose of the programme?

- Training and mentoring
- Publication of Cochrane protocols and reviews
- To enhance the collaboration between the staff of different Cochrane groups

Participants benefit from the clinical and methodological expertise of their hosts, while staff who oversee placements can gain valuable experience in supporting and mentoring colleagues.




What is involved?

- **Duration:** Arrangements are flexible and placements can last for several weeks to several months, depending on the project plan.
- Location: In person and virtual placements can offer greater flexibility.
- **Funding:** Placements involving travel are typically self-funded. In some cases, university funding; some Groups can offer work space or accommodation.
- To apply: contact directly the groups involved in the program


 7 medical students from Lund University had a CIM placement in either Austria, Netherlands, Denmark, South Africa, Spain.

They became co-authors of
 7 Cochrane reviews and 8
 non-Cochrane reviews.



• 18 junior researchers had a CIM placement at Cochrane Sweden, coming from Italy, Poland, Colombia, Austria, Brazil, Japan, Netherlands, Iran, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Jordan, Peru, Greece.

 They became co-authors of 26
 Cochrane reviews and 18 non-Cochrane reviews.












Planned PhD

- Title: "Applied Evidence Syntheses in Health Research"
- Status: submitted for accreditation

Main goals:


- PhD Students become experts in evidence syntheses and conduct methodological work to advance the field
- Students learn how to develop new methods in the field of evidence-based medicine (methods research, meta-research)

Cochrane International Mobility (CIM)

- PhD programme:
- 180 ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System)
- 140 ECTS (thesis + defensio)
- 35 ECTS courses and CIM

- Possible to gain 10 ECTS via CIM
- Students can work at a Cochrane entity with methods expertise in the area of their own PhD topic
- Foster international and interdisciplinary collaboration









