Knowledge translation strategy to support Medicinal Cannabis policy in Colombia: An Example of the Impact of Evidence on Public Health Policy Formulation

BACKGROUND:

The Colombian Ministry of Health needed to establish the enforcement limits of THC for medicinal cannabis products considering:

- Potential consequences for the industry, institutions, health professionals, and patients,
- Implications on the supply and availability of therapeutic options and on the safety of medicinal cannabis users.

A KT strategy was conducted:



POLICY IMPACT

Our KT strategies and products were **useful to improve** the following regulatory and normative practices.

- 1) Direct impact: Technical concept of the Ministry of Health for Resolution 227 of 2022 that regulated Decree 811 of 2021, about licenses, and authorizations for **safe and informed access** to the use of cannabis and cannabis plant, its derivatives, and products.
- 2) Indirect impact: Resolution 2808 of 2022 which that specifies the indications under which medical cannabis is covered in Colombia, allowing **safe access** to the population.
